### 3. Eligibility for admission:

### 3.1 Academic Qualification:

- 1. Bachelors Degree in Sciences/Social Sciences/Humanities under 10+2+3 pattern with 50 % marks/grade altogether/ 50 % marks/grade for Part III alone or Masters Degree with 50% marks/grade or 10+2+5 pattern for integrated M.A/M.S.c Course or 10+2+3+2 pattern for M.Com. However, 10+2+3 pattern is not insisted for BA/BSc degree holders under liberalized scheme of the University of Calicut.
- 2. BA Degree with English language and Literature / Functional English / Communicative English/ BA English and History Double main with 50% marks/grade altogether / 50% Marks/grade for Part-III alone or Master's Degree in English Language and Literature with not less than 50% marks. B.A. English Honours Degree from Central Universities or State Universities with 50 % marks recognised by UGC.
- 3. BA Degree with Malayalam Language and Literature / BA Malayalam and Sociology Double main with 50% marks/grade altogether/50% Marks/grade for Part-III alone or Master's Degree in Malayalam Language and Literature with not less than 50% marks/grade.
- 4. B.A Degree with Hindi Language and Literature/Functional Hindi/ BA Hindi and History Double main with 50% marks/grade altogether/50% Marks/grade for Part-III alone or Master's Degree in Hindi Language and Literature/Functional Hindi with not less than 50% marks/grade.
- 5. B.A Degree with Arabic Language and Literature/ B.A Afzal-Ul-Ulama/ B.A.Functional Arabic / B.A Arabic and Islamic History Double Main/ BA Arabic and History Double main with 50% marks/grade altogether/50% Marks/grade for Part-III alone or Master's Degree in Arabic Language and Literature/ Post Afzal-Ul-Ulama with not less than 50% marks/grade.

- 10. B.Sc. Degree with Physics/ B.Sc Physics with Computer Application/B.Sc. Chemistry with Mathematics and Computer Application/B.Sc Polymer Chemistry/B.Sc.Geology/ B.Sc. Petrochemicals/B.Sc. Bio Chemistry/ B.Sc. Industrial Chemistry/B.Sc. BioPhysics/B.Sc. Applied Physics, B.Sc Electronics, with 50% marks/grade altogether/50% Marks/grade for Part-III alone or M.Sc. Degree with Physics/ Chemistry/Polymer Chemistry /Geology/Petrochemicals/Biochemistry /Industrial Chemistry/ Biophysics/ Applied Physics with 50% marks/grade or M.Sc Photonics (integrated) from CUSAT with 50% marks/grade. Bachelor's in Engineering or Bachelor's in Technology with 55% marks/grade.
- 11. B.Sc. Degree with Botany/Zoology/ Biochemistry/B.Sc. Plant Science/Home Science with Zoology or Botany as subsidiary/B.Sc. Family and Community Science with Zoology or Botany as subsidiary/Aquaculture with Biochemistry and Zoology as Subsidiaries/Biotechnology/Microbiology/Food Technology/Genetics with 50% marks/grade altogether/50% Marks/grade for Part-III alone or M.Sc Degree with Botany/Zoology/ Biochemistry/Plant Science/ Home Science/ Family & Community Science/ Aquaculture/Biotechnology/Microbiology, Food Technology/Genetics with 50% marks/grade or B.Sc Agriculture with Bio-Chemistry and Zoology as subsidiaries with 50% marks/grade.

- 12. B. A. Degree with History/Islamic History/ Arabic and Islamic History double main, B.A Public Administration, BA Malayalam and Sociology Double main/ BA Arabic and History Double main/ BA Arabic and Islamic History Double main/ BA Hindi and History Double main/ BA English and History Double main with 50% marks/grade altogether/50% Marks/grade for Part-III alone or B.A/B.Sc. Degree with Geography/Politics/Economics/Economics with Developmental Economics/Economic with Foreign Trade/Economics with Islamic Finance/ Sociology/Psychology/ Philosophy/West Asian Studies/ with 50% marks/grade altogether/50% Marks/grade for Part-III alone or M.A/M.Sc. Degree in History/Islamic History/Geography/ Politics/ Economics/ Sociology/ Psychology/ Philosophy/ West Asian Studies/ Public Administration with 50% marks/grade. MSW from non-social science stream with 50 % marks/grade in aggregate in the post graduation (MSW). Master of Communication and Journalism with 50% marks/grade (MCJ).
- 13. Candidates who have secured M.Com Degree with not less than 50% marks/grade / MBA with 55% marks/grade in aggregate/equivalent marks/grade.
- 14. Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from other Universities outside Kerala should submit Equivalency Certificate at the time of admission stating that their qualifying examination is recognized as equivalent to the University of Calicut, for seeking admission to B.Ed Degree Special Education (HI) course .
- 15. Double or Triple main candidates or candidates who passed the Degree Examination in Vocational or Specialized Courses are also eligible for admission. However, they have to submit Equivalency Certificate at the time of admission.
- 16. Any other qualification equivalent thereto OR the eligibility requirements, rules and regulations of B.Ed programme admission fixed by the University of Calicut from time to time.
- 17. The candidate who scored 50% marks/grade in aggregate / 50% Marks for Part-III alone in Bachelor's Degree or Masters degree with minimum 50% marks/grade are eligible to apply for B.Ed programme.
- 18. Rounding of marks of 0.5 and above to the highest figure shall not be done while calculating the percentage of marks for minimum eligibility.
- 19. Those candidates who had completed their qualifying examination from other Universities shall produce a percentage certificate from the University concerned, if the same is not mentioned in their final grade card/mark list. If they fail to submit the same at the time of admission, they will not be considered for admission.
- 20. Also any other qualification equivalent thereto or the eligibility requirements, rules and regulations for B.Ed programme fixed by the University of Calicut from time to time

### 4. Relaxation in marks.

The reservation and relaxation for SC/ST/OBC/PWD and other categories shall be as per the rules of Central Government/State Government, whichever is applicable.

- **<u>5. Mandatory Reservation:</u>** Reservation rules of the course are as follows:
- 5.1 Scheduled Caste 8 % of seats and Scheduled Tribe 2 %

In case sufficient eligible applicants under SC/ST quota are not available, the same will be filled up in the following priority

SC seats: By ST/OEC candidates
ST seats: By SC/OEC candidates

### 5.1.2 Reservation for Persons with Disabilities (PwD):

5% Reservation for eligible candidates under persons with disabilities (minimum 40% disability)

Deaf/Dumb candidates are not eligible for admission to the B. Ed. course

Note: Candidates should be physically fit and mentally sound.

### 5.2 Socially and Educationally Backward Classes: 30 %

50 % of the seats will be filled up on the basis of merit and by following the reservation policy of the state Government as given in the table below. The remaining 50 % can be filled up by the educational agency (Management Quota).

### 6. Reservation of Seats for Economically Weaker Sections in general category:

10 % seats reserved for Economically weaker sections (EWS) who are not covered under existing scheme of reservation for the scheduled caste, the scheduled Tribe and the Socially and Educationally backward classes. EWS reservations are available in the affiliated training collges( Other than minority institutions) where reservation to other backward classes are provided. (U.O.No. 4958/2020/Admn Dated, 29.05.2020 & U.O.No. 7158/2020/Admn Dated, 28.07.2020,

7518/2021/Admn Dated 02/08/2021, U.O No. 10306/2022/Admn Dated 21.05.2022). For this purpose 10 % seats are additionally created over and above the sanctioned intake excluding management quota seats.

Please see G.O.(Ms) No.23/2022/P&ARD Dated 04.10.2022, which includes the format for EWS certificate to be obtained from Village Officer. An Income & Assets Certificate below Rs.4lakh (**Appendix I)** or AAY and PHH Certificate (**Appendix II**) issued from Village Officer/Tahsildar should be produced at the time of admission, by the candidates who wish to avail reservation under EWS category. Documents like ration card will not be accepted for availing reservation to this category.

### 7. Selection Criteria

- 7.1.1) Selection is made based on the aggregate marks/grade obtained by the applicants in the UG Degree / PG Degree Examination. This marks/grade will be converted in to 1000. A reduction of 1 % of the index mark for every repeated chance will be made.
- 7.1.1) (a) Special weightage will be given to Post graduation in the subject concerned, First class-5. Second class -3, Third class 1 marks in B.Ed language and non-language optionals. Special weightage of Post-graduation will be given only to the candidate whose index is calculated based on UG Degree marks/grade. No weightage will be given to post graduate qualification if it is in subjects other than the optional chosen for B.Ed programme.
- 7.1.2) 5 marks weightage will be given to candidates who have taken notified eligible UG Degree/ Post graduation from University of Calicut.
- 7.1.3) Candidates who belong to the area under the jurisdiction of the University of Calicut will be given a weightage of 15 marks. Such candidates should produce a nativity certificate issued by the Village Officer/Tahasildar.
- 7.1.4) Candidates (applying under General Quota) having teaching experience in Govt/Aided Schools will be given a weightage of 0.1 score for every completed month of approved teaching service subject to a maximum of 5 points. Total approved service of applicant will also be considered in ranking. Approved service means full time teaching experience (as on the date of notification) in Government/Aided Schools in Kerala State which is to be duly certified by the Controlling Officer ie. Head of the school and Countersigned by the AEO/DEO/Regional Deputy Director in the case of HSST in Form IV of KER.
- 7.1.5) Those who have undergone N.C.C. Training in UG Degree level with a minimum 75% of attendance will be given an additional of 5 marks. This will be added to the aggregate marks secured by the candidate in the qualifying Degree or PG as the case may be for B.Ed admission. NSS candidates/Students worked in the illiteracy Eradication programme in UG Degree level are eligible for 5 marks in their admission to B.Ed programme.
- 7.1.6) A weightage of 10 marks shall be given to the candidates who have completed the Under Graduate Degree Examination with Single main in subject concerned eligible for particular B.Ed options. The criteria of weightage to B.Ed admission for single main graduates can be applicable to the applicants who completed Integrated Post graduation also.

- 7.1.7) Candidates to be exempted from the weightage (to be treated as not eligible for weightage):
  - (1). Bachelor's in Engineering or Bachelor's in Technology.
- (2). Candidates who apply for a B.Ed Special Education on the basis of PG Degree and have no UG Degree notified for admission.
- **8).** Resolving of Tie: The admission of students who obtained same index marks/points shall be decided first on the basis of age and then by name in alphabetical order unless otherwise specified in **Appendix IV**.( U.O.No. GA1/A2/7226/2000 dated 04/05/2001)

### 9). Mode of Registration: Online

The online registration through centralized admission process will be conducted in Two stage.

### 9.1). PROCEDURE OF APPLICATION

Candidates applying for B.Ed Special Education Hearing Impaired -2023 shall visit the University admission website http://admission.uoc.ac.in and access the B.Ed 2023 registration page and complete the registration in the following two steps:

9.1.1) Stage I - CAP ID Creation: Candidate applying for B.Ed Special Education Hearing Impaired -2023 shall initially create a CAP ID by selecting B.Ed Special Education Hearing Impaired using the "NEW CAP REGISTRATION" link provided in the B.Ed 2023 registration page. Mobile number of students/ parents/guardian only to be furnished. After successful submission of the details, CAP ID and Password will be sent to the registered mobile number instantly.

**Registration Completion:** With the CAP ID and Password received in the registered mobile number, the candidate can login and fill the registration page by providing required data. Candidates shall take utmost care while selecting the reservation category, weightage etc during the filling up of registration data.

### Four steps to complete the B.Ed Special Education Hearing Impaired Registration

- 1) Basic Details
- 2) Academic Qualifications
- 3) College Selection
- 4) Online payment & Print application

Candidate should verify the data given in the **verification page** (On verifying if there exists any mistakes, edit the application using **Edit Registration** button). After the verification, click on the **"Proceed to Payment"** button and make payment.

During the payment, the website will be redirected to the University of Calicut Instant Web Payment System (CUIWPS) page where the student can select the Payment Mode and make payment.

9.1.2). **Stage II -Payment for completing the Registration process-** Payment of fee for online registration can be made only through e-payment system (SBI online/SBI e-chalan/ payment gateway system/ Friends Janasevana Kendram/Akshaya kendras)

### 9.1.2) (a) Online Registration Fee

For SC/ST: Rs. 210/- (Rupees Two hundred and ten only)

For Others: Rs. 685/- (Rupees Six hundred and eighty five only)

9.1.3. **Print out of application -**After successful payment, candidate should **put a tick mark** and **"Finalise"** the document and can take the print out of application. No editing will be available after finalising the application.

Note 1: Candidates who made their payment through SBI e-chalan/ Friends Janasevana Kendram/Akshaya kendras will have to re-login to take the print out of the application.

Note 2: In case, the payment fails, the candidates will have to re-login and do the payment procedure once again to complete the payment and obtain the print out of the application.

- 9.1.3.1 Print out of the application will be provided only if the payment is successful. Candidate's application will be considered complete only if he/she has completed the above mentioned steps and is holding a finalised printout showing approved stamp on the candidate's photo.
- 9.1.3.2 The print out of Online application and chalan/payment slips need not be sent to the University, but candidates are directed to keep the same with themselves and shall submit it to the colleges where he/she gets admission". Delayed, incomplete or defective applications will be summarily rejected without notice. *Candidates should submit the Online print out of B.Ed Special Education Hearing Impaired application at the time of admission.*

### 10. Admission

There is no online allotment for Special Education(Hearing Impaired) B.Ed programme in AWH college of Teacher Education, Kozhikode. University will forward the Rank list of online registered students to the College. College will conduct admissions as per the admission schedule published by the University. Candidates or representatives of the candidates are permitted to attend on the date prescribed for admission in AWH College of Education, Calicut.

- e) Transfer Certificate (obtained from the last institution studied) and Conduct Certificate (obtained within 6 months)
- f) Nativity Certificate from the Village Officer in respect of those who are eligible for Nativity Weightage.
- g) Community Certificate from the competent Authority in the case of SC/ST/OEC/ ETB/MU/OBH/LC and SIUC candidates.
- h) Non-creamy layer certificate /Income Certificate in the case of candidates eligible for admission under community reservation.
- i) Medical Certificate for Visually/Orthopaedically Handicapped (Percentage of disability should be specified in the certificate issued by the Govt. Medical Board).

- j) Experience Certificate in Form IV of KER for claiming admission under Teachers Quota and for getting Weightage for teaching experience for those applying under Merit Quota. These Certificates should be signed by the Head of the School and Counter signed by A.E.O./D.E.O/Regional Deputy Director in the case of HSST.
- k) A certificate from the Head Master stating that the teacher has applied through proper channel for eligible leave to undergo B. Ed course should be produced.
- I) Any other certificates from the competent authorities for the claim for admission under any specific quota weightage.
- m) A community certificate along with the Income & Assets Certificate (Ref: G.O.(Ms) No.128/2020/HEDN Dated 20.03.2020) issued from Village Officers/ Thahasildar should be produced by the candidates who wish to avail reservation under EWS category at the time of admission.

### a) English Option

If two candidates have same index marks, priority may be given to the candidates who secure more marks in Part III under single\*/double\*\*/triple\*\*\* main. If there is again a tie, then marks of Part I or Language I and then Part II or Language II shall be considered. Even after there is a tie, then general conditions\*\*\*\* shall be applied.

### b) Other Language Options (Malayalam, Hindi, Arabic, Tamil, Sanskrit, Urdu)

If two candidates have same index marks, priority may be given to the candidates who secure more marks in Part III under single/double/triple main. If there is again a tie, then marks of Part II or Language II and then Part I or Language I shall be considered. Even after there is a tie, then general conditions shall be applied.

- \* = Core +Complementary I +Complementary II or Main + Subsidiary I + Subsidiary II
- \*\* = Core I + Core II or Main I + Main II
- \*\*\* = Core I + Core II + Core III or Main I + Main II + Main III

### II) B.Ed Other optionals

### Mathematics Option & Physical Science Option

If two candidates have same index marks, priority shall be given to the candidates who secure more marks in Part III under single/double/triple main. If there is again a tie, then marks of Part I or Language I and then Part II or Language II shall be considered. Even after there is a tie, then general conditions shall be applied.

Note: Bachelor's in Engineering or Bachelor's in Technology-General Conditions only shall be applied.

### Natural Science Option & Social Science Option

If two candidates have same index marks, priority may be given to the candidates who secure more marks in Part III under single/double/triple main. If there is again a tie, then marks of Part I or Language I and then Part II or Language II shall be considered. Even after there is a tie, then general conditions shall be applied.

### Commerce Option - for M.Com/MBA degree

If candidates have same index marks, preference may be given to the M.Com holders. If there is tie among M.Com holders, general conditions shall be applied.

 $\underline{\text{General Conditions}}$  - The admission of the students who obtained the same index marks/points
